Quincy man indicted for murder In fatal barroom beating

A Norfolk County Grand Jury today (May 27, 2015) indicted Paul J. Fahey, 42, of Lind St., Quincy, for Murder, Intimidation of a Witness and Carrying a Dangerous Weapon (to wit: extendable baton) in the March 23 attack that cost Keith W Boudreau his life several days later, according to Norfolk District Attorney Michael W. Morrissey.

Fahey was initially arraigned and pled not guilty to assault charges on April 1, 2015, before Boudreau succumbed to his injuries on April 3, 2015. He pled not guilty to the murder in district court and has been held without bail.

Assistant District Attorney Craig Kowalski presented the evidence to the grand jury resulting in today's indictment.

"We thank the Quincy Police Department and the Massachusetts State Police for their work investigating this incident and identifying a suspect," District Attorney Morrissey said.

The attack, which is believed to have been entirely unprovoked, took place in the Home Ice Sports Bar in the city of Quincy.

The intimidation of a witness charge relates to statements Fahey is alleged to have made, subsequent to the attack, to another party present at the bar. The weapon charge relates to an item allegedly recovered from his vehicle.

The Superior Court arraignment date has not yet been fixed.

As with all criminal defendants, Paul Fahey enjoys the Constitutional presumption of innocence unless and until found quilty beyond a reasonable doubt.
