ARREST IN QUINCY MURDER

Quincy and State Police detectives have arrested a Quincy woman in the September 11, 2020, murder of 24-year old Cameron Nohmy.

"Alyssa Dellamano, age 22, was arrested at a residence in Weymouth this morning pursuant to a murder warrant issued Monday by the Quincy District Court," Norfolk District Attorney Michael W. Morrissey said. "We are working to schedule an arraignment this afternoon at the Quincy District Court.

In addition to Dellamano, police have arrested Samantha Perrier, 24, of Dedham. She has been charged with misleading police during the investigation.

"Assistant District Attorney Carolyn Hely will represent the Commonwealth," District Attorney Morrissey said. "The Quincy Police have been excellent partners with State Police in this investigation. We are grateful to the State Police Violent Fugitive Apprehension Section, and the Weymouth, Malden, and Plainville police for their assistance during our attempts to locate Dellamano. Now this process moves forward into court."

After being taken into custody without incident, the defendant was transported to the Quincy Police Headquarters for processing. It is expected that she will be transported to Quincy District court for arraignment.

POST-ARRAIGNMENT UPDATE:

Alyssa Dellamano entered a plea of not guilty to the charge of murder at her Quincy District Court arraignment this afternoon. Judge Diane Moriarty ordered that she be held without bail, and that she be returned to court October 19, 2020, for a probable cause hearing.

Dellamano was represented by Attorney Thomas Iovieno, of Canton.

Assistant District Attorney Carolyn Hely told the court that investigators do not have reason to believe that the defendant knew victim Cameron Nohmy prior to the deadly interacting on Friday night.

Samantha Perrier entered a plea of not guilty to the charge of misleading police during this investigation. (Note that there is no allegation that she was present at the scene of the homicide.) Judge Moriarty imposed \$10,000 cash bail with conditions that should she post bail she must stay away from and have no contact with Dellamano and be fitted with a GPS monitoring device. She is also due back in Quincy District Court on 10/19/20. She was represented by Attorney Steve Lowell.

All defendants are presumed innocent until proven quilty beyond a reasonable doubt.
