Press Release DA Morrissey delivers Millis 2012 School Security Grant

District Attorney Michael W. Morrissey was at Millis High this week and took the opportunity to present the School Department with a check for \$2,000 for security improvements.

"Millis applied for funds to buy and install security cameras at the Clyde Brown Elementary School," District Attorney Morrissey said. "We were pleased to be able to award them the maximum amount available."

Morrissey started offering grants to Norfolk County's public schools last year, just after taking office. Eight communities applied for and won grants last year. This year, Millis is among 21 towns to be awarded the grants, which are directed at making capital improvements to public school properties and buildings that make students and facilities more secure. "All of the grants are funded out of drug forfeiture funds," Morrissey said. "That means the money being invested in our schools was previously confiscated from drug traffickers who were then prosecuted in Norfolk County courts."

"We hope to continue the longstanding partnership we have with the Millis Schools and the Millis Police Department as we work together to keep our children safe," District Attorney Morrissey said. "It is clear that Millis is strong in seeking the resources and help they need to do so."
