Bail set in nude drunk driving case

A Randolph man arrested by the Massachusetts State Police allegedly drunk, naked and behaving lewdly in the Blue Hills Reservation denied those allegations at his arraignment Monday, August 13, 2012 and was ordered held on \$8,500 bail.

Walter V. Pimentel, 55, was arrested at 6:25 p.m. on Saturday, August 11 after State Police Trooper John McCarthy responded to a call from a passerby reporting a naked man touching himself in the area of "The Overlook," which affords a view of the Boston skyline. Tpr. McCarthy found Pimentel in his white Nissan Pathfinder and made observations of the defendant that caused him to place him under arrest.

Pimentel pled not guilty at his Quincy District Court Arraignment on Monday to the following charges:

- 1. Operating Under the Influence, 5th or subsequent offense
- 2. Open and Gross Lewdness (subsequent offense)
- 3. Wanton lewd and lascivious conduct
- 4. Indecent Exposure
- 5. Operating with a license revoked as an habitual traffic offender
- 6. Operating after suspension for OUI
- 7. Possession of an open container of alcohol

Assistant District Attorney Farah Hill asked Quincy District Court Judge Mark Coven to order \$25,000 cash bail for the defendant. The court ordered \$8,500 cash bail or \$85,000 surety. He is due to return to Quincy District Court September 11, 2012 at 9 a.m. for a probable cause hearing. Attorney Patti Wasserman defended Pimentel at arraignment; Ethan Yankowitz as appointed his attorney for future court dates.

All defendants are presumed innocent until proven guilty beyond a reasonable doubt.
