Quincy woman found not presently competent For trial on homicide of her children

The Quincy woman under indictment for the 2009 murder of her daughter and manslaughter of her unborn son was deemed not presently competent to stand trial following a hearing in Norfolk Superior Court today, August 24, 2012.

Judge Raymond P. Veary heard testimony from a clinician from Worcester State Hospital, where Fan Chi-Xue, now age 41, is presently committed. Judge Veary stayed the matter pending her regaining competency, Norfolk District Attorney Michael W. Morrissey said after the hearing.

Fang Chi-Xue has been hospitalized, first for physical injuries and subsequently for evaluation and treatment, since being found unresponsive and bleeding from a slashed wrist in her Woodbine Street, Quincy, apartment about 10:30 p.m. on April 16, 2009. Her 9-year-old daughter, Wen Xue, was found dead in bed beside her, allegedly strangled and with her wrist also cut, DA Morrissey said.

An autopsy revealed that the defendant was 8 months pregnant with a son; the basis for the manslaughter indictment is the medical opinion that the boy was viable and that the mother's alleged self-inflicted wounds caused his death.

Fang Chi-Xue was returned to Worcester State Hospital following the hearing, where she remains committed under Chapter 123 Sec. 16 (c).

All defendants are presumed innocent until proven guilty beyond a reasonable doubt.
